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Abbreviations:

M.O.W.T. = Ministry of War Transport (Names of ships built for MOWT were prefixed with the word "Empire.")

O.N. = Official Number

Before IMO numbers, each country had its own shipping register and each ship had its own number in that register. In Britain they called that number the "Official Number," (O.N). This was changed to the register of any country that the ship was subsequently sold to.

Sometimes there was more than one ship that had the same name, so the ON is another means of identification.

The management of each "Empire" ship was given to a shipping company as soon as it was built and sometimes the shipping companies bought the ships after the war
